Best Practice -I

1. Title of the practice: Women Empowerment

2. Goal:

As an Institute of Higher Education established especially for young girls, one of the chief functions of the Institute is to develop and deploy action plans for effective implementation of practices reflecting to women empowerment in line with Institutional vision that is to strengthen the societal structure by raising social competence of women through education and to create equal opportunities for higher education to the girls from all socio-economic status. The main aim of the practice is to solve problems in self development of students and train them to realize their potentiality for solving problems by themselves. They should be empowered to be self-confident and self-reliant to become better human beings.

3. The Context:

As an institute exclusively established and working for holistic development of the young girls, the Women Development Cell of the college organizes activities in line with Institute's vision and mission. For resolving issues pertaining to sexual harassment Women Development Cell (WDC) had been formed in our Institute as per the Supreme Court guidelines and directive issued by State Government, which strives for better working condition of girl students and female employees of the college. Its formation is as follows:

In addition, we have a student grievance redressal cell comprising of senior female faculties. Presently Dr. Sangeetaben C. Acharya, Associate Professor of Economics is a chair person of the cell. The prime function of the cell is to help the students in getting their problems satisfactorily solved.

4. The Practice

During the entire year WDC arranges series of programmes on the campus about educating women in issues related to women security, harassment and empowerment.

The activities of the cell consist of:

- Lectures by the panel of doctors on 'Common Health Issues in Women'
- Celebration of 'World Woman Day'
- Legal Awareness programmes on 'Domestic Violence' and 'Consumer Protection'

- ➤ Visit of Police Station to be familiar about security provisions for women.
- Arrangement of 'Yoga Session' at every Saturday morning

Besides above practices, the Institute organizes various workshops, lectures and talks to sensitize the girl students and the society at large about the cross cutting issues such as Women Empowerment, Female Foeticide, Population Growth and Control, Gender Justice, Health Management, Human Rights, Child Abuse etc.

From the last two years in the month of August the Institute observes 'Women Empowerment Fortnight' as directive by the State Government. Throughout these fifteen days officers and experts from the Judiciary, Police and NGOs are invited for executing programmes on themes of empowering the role of women in society at large.

Women Development Cell (WDC) of the Institute conducts series of activities in forms of addressing the personal and psycho-social problems faced by young girls. Department of Psychology also periodically organizes expert lectures and workshops on personality development, enhancing communication and life skills, public speaking and leadership skill.

Above and beyond our faculty members are very supportive in guiding students who may be facing problems. Students are encouraged to share their problems. They discuss and obtain guidance in matters pertaining to career choices, personal adjustments, financial constraints, family pressures, problems of adjustment with classmates and various other such issues.

The college provides additional skill oriented programs for empowering the young students through enhancing the skills which enable them to regional employment markets The Institute has started following certificate programs under UGC Scheme of 'Career Oriented Course'. They are all directed towards the enhancement of career opportunities.

1. Title of the practice: National Service Scheme (NSS)/ Community Service

2. Goal:

The Motto of NSS "Not Me But You", reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for self-less service. Activities executed by NSS Unit helps the students to develop appreciation to other person's point of view and also show consideration to other living beings. The extension activities organized through NSS Unit provide a platform to mould the personality of young girls to be a socially responsible person. The aim of education is also to mould our students into good citizens. This extension activity brings out the potential of students through community service and engagement.

3. The Context:

In organization of extension and outreach programmes, the NSS Unit has been at the forefront since the inception of the Institute. The Programme Officer and Committee members of the Unit prepare a comprehensive plan of activities to be carried out throughout the year inside and outside the campus. While filling up the admission form student is asked for her interest and makes choice one of any two activities such as NSS and Sports which is mandatory for the First Year Students. First year students are oriented towards various activities related to community services and social awareness to be organized during year through a programme in the beginning of the academic session. The institution promotes the participation of students in extension activity of NSS. These students are encouraged to participate in the activities of NSS and necessary funds and infrastructure for the same are provided.

4. The Practice

The activities conducted throughout the year with active participation of the students complement students' academic learning experience and they learn / develop:

- > To understand the community in which they work and live and realize their relation to their community.
- > To identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem-solving.
- To develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility.
- ➤ To develop competence required for group-living and sharing of responsibilities by acquiring leadership qualities and democratic attitudes.
- ➤ To develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters and perform national integration and social harmony.
- > To enhance the values like altruism, selfless service, charity and humanitarian attitude.
- To sensitize for the ecology and environmental issues and develop habits to protect it.
